Upon reading respondent's affidavit with exhibits sworn to
May 30, 2019 and her supplemental affidavit with exhibits sworn
to July 17, 2019, and upon reading the correspondence by the
Attorney Grievance Committee for the Third Judicial Department
in response dated July 3, 2019, and having determined, by clear

and convincing evidence, that (1) respondent has complied with the order of suspension and the Rules of this Court, (2) respondent has the requisite character and fitness to practice law, and (3) it would be in the public interest to reinstate respondent to the practice of law (see Matter of Attorneys in Violation of Judiciary Law § 468-a [Serbinowski], 164 AD3d 1049, 1050 [2018]; Matter of Attorneys in Violation of Judiciary Law § 468-a [Squires], 153 AD3d 1511, 1513 [2017]), it is

ORDERED that respondent's motion for reinstatement is granted; and it is further

ORDERED that respondent is reinstated as an attorney and counselor-at-law, effectively immediately.
